#### **Old Testament Lesson: Proverbs 1:1-9 (NRSV)**

<sup>1</sup> The proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel:

#### Prologue

<sup>2</sup> For learning about wisdom and instruction, for understanding words of insight,

<sup>3</sup> for gaining instruction in wise dealing, righteousness, justice, and equity;

<sup>4</sup> to teach shrewdness to the simple, knowledge and prudence to the young—

<sup>5</sup> let the wise, too, hear and gain in learning and the discerning acquire skill,

<sup>6</sup> to understand a proverb and a figure, the words of the wise and their riddles.

<sup>7</sup> The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; fools despise wisdom and instruction.

<sup>8</sup> Hear, my child, your father's instruction, and do not reject your mother's teaching, <sup>9</sup> for they are a fair garland for your head and pendants for your neck.

#### New Testament Lesson: James 3:13-18 (NRSV)

Two Kinds of Wisdom

<sup>13</sup> Who is wise and knowledgeable among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. <sup>14</sup> But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be arrogant and lie about the truth. <sup>15</sup> This is not wisdom that comes down from above but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. <sup>16</sup> For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. <sup>17</sup> But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. <sup>18</sup> And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

Drawing on numerous scriptural images of Wisdom (Greek: *Sophia*), especially in Proverbs, this text offers an alternative perspective on Trinitarian theology. The Wisdom tradition has played a role in Christian mysticism for centuries, as witnessed by the Hagia Sophia in Istanbul.

These stanzas are selected from a 20th-century English poetic version of an Irish monastic prayer dating to the 10th century or before. They are set to an Irish folk melody that has proved popular and easily sung despite its lack of repetition and its wide range.


#### **New Member Informational Meeting**
