**Alcoholics Anonymous**— **Saturday Night Live**: On the first Saturday of every month, this large, popular meeting of AA has met in our gym for many years.

**Stockton Bulls Basketball Team**: This basketball program serves Junior High school students and can be found in our gym practicing every Tuesday and Thursday evening.

Changeist: This youth volunteer organization began using our campus last November. Junior High students, High School students, and Americorp fellows participate in this seven month program which meets in both of our buildings three Saturdays a month. During their full day on our campus (9-4), the participants learn about community service organizations and develop their awareness of the challenges facing our city. In cohorts, they also come up with their own service activity and are supported to complete it as part of the program. Recently Changeist has unfortunately lost all of their Americorp fellows due to cuts from the federal government. Please keep their staff and students in prayer, as well as their Americorp fellows.

**Little Manila Rising:** For the last few years, Little Manila Rising's ECHO team has hosted a wellness fair, and occasionally comes to provide information during our Food Pantry.

**Department of Public Health:** Just this year, the San Joaquin Department of Public Health has become a regular staple during our Food Pantry distributions. Their team of medical and social support staff arrive two hours before our Food Pantry opens to provide vital testing, treatment, and connection to continued care for the people waiting in line. We are delighted that our neighbors who come to the Food Pantry receive this additional type of care!

The **Midtown Food Pantry** is jumping! We now average between 90-100 people per week, feeding over 100!



#### **EASTER 2025 & KEENE'S FAREWELL**




