#### From the Pastor

#### ~1 Corinthians 12:4-7

## Gethsemane volunteers to help with Salvation Army meals

Gethsemane provides volunteers on the first Tuesday of each month to make meatballs and pack the meal into clam shells. Another team in the middle of the month makes 4+ large pans of lasagna as well as 3 deep pans of chicken alfredo (though no serving, just preparing).

The Generosity team is kicking it up a notch. In June we have booked in 3 times to help at the Salvation Army.

Wednesday, June 14 food preparation (no serving) from as early as 9:30 am (later for an easier meal) and working until done....by 12:30 or earlier. A kitchen/meal manager can be available to lead. We look for a simple meal—not a Thanksgiving buffet. Probably lots of chopping and slicing. Need 4 people to help. Gloves and a snack of coffee and 3-day old donuts provided to volunteers.

Thursday, June 22 serving an already prepared meal from 12:30 to 3:30. Two people to fill the clam shells with food, one volunteer to answer the door when the doorbell is rung and take out the number of clam shells requested, and one volunteer to tally meals going out the door.

<u>Tuesday</u>, <u>June 27</u> repeat of June 22 serving times and jobs.

During the winter the number of meals distributed was 100 or less each day. When the snow cleared, the numbers were up to 130 to 170 everyday Monday through Friday. The Salvation Army is the only place in town for a free meal M-F.

### WARM YOUR HEART COMMUNITY CLOTHESLINE and FOOD PANTRY

Spring is here and summer is just around the corner, but let's keep contributing to our Community Clothesline.

Do you have extra jackets, shirts, sweatshirts, pants, shoes, T-Shirts, etc....? I'm sure any type of clothing will be helpful.

You can help your neighbors by putting each item in a plastic bag to keep it dry, labeling it (for example, "child hat, size M" or "men's jacket, size XL"), and clip it anywhere on the 'clothesline' [on the fence] on the west side of the church! (Clothespins are on site). The Community Clothesline is accessible at all times (24/7) from both the north and south parking lots.


