#### as you go

### family **DEVOTION**

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

#### **SUMMARY:** MARK 1:1-13

Mark doesn't record the story of Jesus's birth or Jesus's genealogy like other Gospel writers do; he launches right into the action by introducing John the Baptist. John was sent to announce Jesus's coming and to prepare the way for the long-awaited Messiah. He did this by baptizing people in the Jordan river as a sign of repentance and forgiveness of sin. This section finishes with Jesus's own baptism by John and the miraculous way that God appeared to confirm that Jesus is His Son.

#### discussion questions

Why do you think John lived in such a strange way? What did this teach people about Jesus and His mission?

.02 Why were people going to John to be baptized? Why do we get baptized today as followers of Jesus?

**PRAY:** Thank God that He left no room for doubt that Jesus is His Son. Thank Him for leaving us the Gospels—eyewitness accounts of Jesus's life, death, and resurrection. Pray that He would teach you more about Himself through your study of the book of Mark.
